



Manures .- Get out much muck to be exposed to the weather in winter, for use next year; collect everything thas may increase the supply in the hog pen stables, barn yard, or compost heaps of manure. Roots .- Store in cool cellars after sweating ; free them from tops and dirt when put in.

Sheep .- Provide comfortable sheds give them a good range ; if housed, tree ventilation and clean quarters, not crowed .---Each sheep should have 10 to 15 square feet surface room, (equivalent to a space 21 by 4 feet, or 3 by 5 feet foreach one); not more than 100 to 150 should be confined in the same room. Turn in the buck this month for April lambs, but they do better if dropped in May, in colder locali ties.

Turnips and Carrol's -Dig before the ground is liable to freeze, and store them after sweating.

Winter Grain .- It is better for it to have to much growth than too little .-Never feed off at this late season. Look to the surface drains, that water may not stand in them, and that side hills be no. exposed to washing by overflowing.

Wood for Fuel .- Much good fuel may
