

No orchard should be permitted to run to grass until the trees have attained good size ; and even then nothing of larger growth than the short herbage of sheep pastures. The top dressing of manure which these animals will give the orchard will prove another advantage . An additional scattering of manure from the yard in autumn will make up the doficiency of growth occasioned by a concering of turf.


How to bring up Sandy Land.

Jas. Clayton, Mason county, Illinois, writes : We have a good deal of land in this county on which nothing but rye can be grown, it being nearly clear sand .--What is the best way to improve the sandy soil ? Such land may probably be brought up into the seasons so that a toierable crop of corn, wheat and roots will follow in a fow years. Buckwheat sown new on land which has a small dressing of some ammonical, manure, 100 to 150 pounds of Guano, or 200 or 300 pounds of bone dust per acte, will give a good growth probably. Plow this under soon after the first blossoms appear, and then sow rye. In spring, say the middle of May or first of June, when the rye begins to head, turn it under and sow corn, or sorghum broadcast, (or in drills if the land is weedy, which it probably is not) and plow this under in August, and if desired, buckwheat or turnips may be sowed, (the latter quite thickly) and this crop plowed under; the buckwheat before frost, or the turnips before hard freezing. After this you will be able in all probability to get a good crop of red clover, which means wheat or snything else, (after it) provided the same system is kept up, and a well manured crop is introduced once in about four years.
