

DRYING Cows .- Some cows give milk till up to the calving time-some plentifully so it is not easy to dry them-and here a great deal of evil occurs. The milk left to accumulate in the bag hurts the bag ; the loss of a teat is generally the result. Many owners of cows cannot account for this loss. Trace it back and you will see it was in consequence of permitting the milk to remain in the bag. This will cake and cause inflamation, resulting in what we have mentioned. It is hence that our best cows are unfortunate in their udders. In drying a cow, especially one giving plentifully of milk, the milk every few days should be drawn from the udder. In a few weeks there will be a little or no milk secreted; the ob is then performed. Be particular about this thing, and save your cows .- Rural

FERDING FOWLS. In Winter the fowls they are not frequently followed by those "direful disof many farms where they are well sup-plied with grain suffer for lack of animal food. That they need such food or at least have a natural appetite for it is fully proved by the avidity with which they devour all sorts of bugs, worms and grasshoppers when running at large in sum-mer-time. Try them in Winter with any kind of fresh meat, cooked or raw, cut up in suitable bits for them to pick up, and see how greedily they will eat it and how such food make hen lay. The pressed cakes of tailowmelted scraps make a good cheap food for fowls is winter by merely soaking it so the hens can cat it.

PROTECTING PEACH TREES FROM THE RAVAGES OF INSECTS -An experienced borticulturist informs us that it has been ascertained by setual experiments, that watering the ground round the body of peach trees with a solution of copperas, is an effectual method of destroying the worms that injure the roots of the trees.

The operation is performed by desolving one onnce of copperas in a gallon of water, and wattering with it three times a week for two weeks, - Cin. Gazetts,

How To FILL AN ICE House .- The Utica Herald cays that the ice house of L. R. Lyon, of Lyon's Falls, N. Y., has not been empty for twenty years, nor has a pound of see ever been put into it. The building is constructed after the ordinary method, and when it is designed to fill it, a rose jet is placed upon the water pipe, and as the water comes through it is chilled and drops into the ice house, where it forms one solid mass.

MANURING TREES .- Now is the good time to put some manure round your fruit trees. The early spring rains will carry for which it is recommended. the soluble eliments into the soil, and cause them to start with fresh vigor in early spring and summer. Apple trees will send out their roots a great distance for food. We recently cut off roots a distance of forty feet from an apple tree. Thus a single tree may extend its roots across the diameter of a circle two bundred and fifty feet in circumference .- Am. Farmer,

Horses .- Any one may have noticed that when horses are fed with oats, many grains come through them without being masticated. The grain, in fact, has received so little injury that it germinates and grows vigorously, under favorable circumstance. It is evident, therefore, that the horse has obtained no nutriment from such grains. Experiments show that by bruising or grinding, the benefit to the horse is much . The London Ombibus Company, which it is said keeps 6,500 horses, experimented by feeding one-half of them on bruised oats, cat hay and straw, and the other half on uncut fodder and whole cats, "The allowance on the first system was bruised oats, 16lbs. ; out straw, 21 lbs. The allowance to the second was unbruised oats, 19 lbs. ; uncut hay and straw, 13 pounds. The bruised oats, hay and straw amounted to 26 pounds., and the unbruised oats, hay and straw, to 32 pounds. The horses that had the bruised oats, with cut hay and straw, consumed,26 pounds per day. and performed as much work and kept in as good condition as the horses that had 82 pounds per day.'
