

TREASURER'S SALE OF UNSEATED LANDS.		
AGREABLY to the provisions of an Act of Assembly, entitled an act directing the mode of selling Unseated Lands for taxes, and for other purposes, passed the 13th day of March, 1815, and the further supplementary thereto, passed the 13th day of March, 1817; 25th day of March, 1821; and 9th day of March, 1847, the Treasurer of the county of Columbia, hereby gives notice to all persons concerned, that unless the County, Road, School, and State taxes due on the following tracts of Unseated Land, situate in Columbia county, are paid before the day of sale, the whole or such parts of such tract as will pay the taxes and costs chargeable thereon, will be sold at the Court House, in Bloomsburg, county of Columbia, on the second Monday of June next, 1856, and be continued by adjournment, from day to day, for arrears of taxes due said county, and the cost accrued on each tract respectively.
