BY AUTHORITY.
RESOLUTION
PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Received by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the following amendments are proposed to the constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the sixth article thereof.

ARTICLE XI.
OF PUBLIC DEBTS.
Sec. 1. The state may contract debts, to supply casual deficits or failures in revenues, or to meet expenses not otherwise provided for; but the aggregate amount of such debts direct and contingent, whether contracted by virtue of one or more acts of the general assembly, or at different periods of time, shall never exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand dollars, and the money arising from the creation of such debts, shall be applied to the purpose for which it was contracted, and to no other purpose whatever.

ARTICLE XII.
OF NEW COUNTIES.
No county shall be divided by a line cutting off over one tenth of its population, (either to form a new county or otherwise) without the express assent of such county, by a vote of the electors thereof; nor shall any new county be established, containing less than four hundred square miles.
