"The Pops in answer to the 'various correspondents,' which persist in affirming that King Victor Emmanuel is disposed to accept the dictatorship which has been offered him by certain towns in the Roman States, asserts that all these rumors are completely false, and that the King has refused any sort of dictatorship, whether 'provisional' or otherwise.
