The majority for the Democratic candidate was forty eight.

FATAL ACCIDENT.—On Friday afternoon last, Mr. NATHAN GREENWALT, met with an accident, which proved fatal in the course of two hours, at the Plaining Mill of Thom as Edgar, in Epsom, this county. The circumstances attending this lamentable accident, as near as we can learn, are as follows: While engaged oiling or arranging the machinery, his clothing were caught by a shaft, which was making a large amount of revolutions per minute, cutting his whole body around it dislocating one leg, terribly fracturing the other in two places, tearing one hand, and completely mashing in the right side of his whole body, besides injuring him in almost every manner possible. His body passed through between two girders and the shaft, which are said to be so close together, that they would barely admit of the body passing through. He was a sober, industrious, and valuable citizen; though poor, but much respected and esteemed by all who knew him, and leaves a loving wife, with seven small children, to mourn his untimely death. He had a pleasant smile and a cheerful "How do you do?" for every person he met. His death cast quite a gloom over the community in which he resided, as well as throughout the county, where he had acquaintances. Mrs. Harrison and others, were called upon, but his injuries were so great that it was impossible to save his life.
