sioner or otherwise, a subordinate officer,  
agent or clerk, or shall be employed under  
the Legislature, executive or judicial de-  
partment of this State, or of any city or  
of any incorporated district, and also,  
that every member of Congress and of the  
State Legislature, and of the select or com-  
mon council of any city, or commissioner  
of any incorporated district, is by law  
incapable of holding or exercising at the  
time, the office or appointment of Judge,  
Justice, or Clerk of any election of this  
Commonwealth, and that no Justice, or  
Judge or other officer of such election  
shall be eligible to be then voted for.  
And the said act of assembly entitled  
"an act relating to elections of this Com-  
monwealth," passed July 2, 1819, further  
provides as follows, viz:

"In case the person who shall have re-  
ceived the highest number of votes for In-  
spector shall not attend on the day of any  
election, then the person who shall have  
received the second highest number of  
votes for Judge at the next preceding elec-  
tion shall act as Inspector in his place.  
And in case the person who has received  
the second highest number of votes for In-  
spector shall not attend, the person elected  
Judge shall appoint an Inspector in his  
place, and if any vacancy still continue  
in the board for the space of one hour after  
the time fixed by law for the opening of  
the election, the qualified voters of the  
precinct, who are present, or who such  
officer shall have been elected, present at  
the election, shall elect one of their num-  
ber to fill such vacancy.  
It shall be the duty of the several As-  
sessors respectively to attend at the place  
of holding every general, special or town-  
ship election during the whole time such  
election is kept open, for the purpose of  
giving information to the Inspectors and  
Judges, when called on, in relation to the  
right of any person to vote, or to vote  
as such election, and on such other mat-  
ters in relation to the assessment of  
voters, as the said Inspectors or either of  
them shall from time to time require.  
No person shall be permitted to vote at  
any election as aforesaid, than a white citi-  
zen of the age of twenty-one or more,  
who shall have resided in this State at  
least one year, and in the election district  
where he offers to vote, ten days immedi-  
ately preceding such election, and without  
two years paid a State or County tax which  
shall have been assessed at least ten days  
before the election. But a citizen of the  
United States who has previously been a  
qualified voter of this State and removed  
therefrom and returned, and who shall have  
resided in the election district and paid  
taxes, aforesaid, shall be entitled to vote  
at any election in this State, six months  
before that the white freemen, citizens  
of the United States, between the age of  
twenty-one and twenty-two years who  
have resided in the election district ten  
days as aforesaid shall be entitled to vote,  
although they shall not have paid tax.  
No person shall be permitted to vote  
whose name is not contained in the list of  
taxable inhabitants, furnished by the Com-  
missioner, unless: First, he produce a  
receipt of payment, within two years of  
said State or County tax assessed, in ac-  
cordance with the Constitution, and for  
the Constitution, and give satisfactory evi-  
dence on his own oath or affirmation of  
another that he has paid such a tax, or in  
failure to produce receipt shall make oath  
to the payment thereof, or second, if he
