ALSO In and by virtue of the 14th Sec. tion of the act aloresaid, every person, excepting Justices of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit of trust under the Government of the United States, or of this State, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer, or otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent, who is, or shall be employed under the the legislative, executive of judiciary department of this State, or of the United States, or of any city or incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress, and of the State Legislature and of the Select or Common Council of any City, or Commissioner of any incorpurated district, is by law incapable of holding or excreising at the same time, the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector, or Clerk of any election of this Commonwealth, and that no Judge, Inspector; or other officer of any such election shall be eligible to any office to be then voted for.
