Hart, pastor of the church, said this morning. The majority of these new churchgoers are not regular attendants at any church. Mr. Hart has learned, and he emphatically stated this morning that he is assured of the success of church advertising.

"I am still experimenting with advertising methods. I use three kinds of publicity, display ads in the newspapers, circulars distributed from door to door and cards given out in the church. I am not sure yet which method is bringing the best results." To show that the church ads are attracting attention, the Rev. Dr. Hart told of a professional man who spoke to him about it. "This man, who is not a regular churchgoer," said Mr. Hart, "remarked about the ads of our services. He told me 'Now you are using common sense in your religious work.'"

**Consider Joint Advertising**  
Mr. Hart is of the opinion that the question of joint advertising will soon be brought before the ministerial associations of the city. "In other cities, joint advertising is being done, and the churches in this city will surely adopt a method which we are finding to be of great help."

#### Fitzsimmons Too Old to Fight in New York State

New York, Jan. 27.—The Supreme Court to-day denied the application of Robert Fitzsimmons, one time heavyweight ring champion of the world, for an injunction restraining the New York Athletic Commission from refusing to sanction his participation in boxing exhibitions in this State. The commission held that Fitzsimmons, who is 51 years of age, is too old again to enter the ring. Justice Seabury ruled that the commission was within its rights in making such an order.
