### President of Republic of Peru Made Prisoner

Lima, Peru, Feb. 4.—The president of the republic of Peru, Guillermo Billinghurst, was taken prisoner today by military revolutionists.

The rebels suddenly attacked the presidential palace this morning under the leadership of Colonel Benavides.

General Enrique Varela, premier and minister of war, was killed in the sharp fighting which ensued.

Dr. Augusto Durand, a former revolutionary leader, whose arrest was sought by the police yesterday, took possession of the palace. It is generally believed that he will at once organize a new government.

Peru's sudden revolutionary trouble is due principally to President Billing-hurst's earnest efforts to place the finances of his country on a sound basis. His scheme for doing this involved the strictest economies throughout the public service and naturally proved unpopular, particular among office sholders who saw their salaries and estimates pruned with a merciless hand.
