SUFFRAGISTS TO START CAMPAIGN

Legislators Will Have to Pledge Themselves to Support the Amendment Now

Women's political committee will be named during the conference on primary elections at State suffrage headquarters here early in March. The duty of those committees all over the State will be to secure from all candidates for nomination to the State House of Representatives a pledge to support the bill providing for a vote by the electors of the State on the question of woman suffrage, and in-

terview, the leaders say, must be on file in the State archives bearing the gentleman's signature.

The candidates of every political party will be informed that a refusal to give a pledge of support will be considered opposition. The non-partisan policy of the State Suffrage Association and of the woman suffrage party will be adhered to. Support will not, therefore, be offered to any candidate but an active campaign will be waged against all candidates opposed to the measure. Interviewing candidates and securing their pledge of support is the immediate work. The plan of work for the four weeks' active campaign between April 21 and May 19 will be considered at the above mentioned conference of division, county and legislative district chairmen. Records of all members of the General Assembly of 1913 who opposed the woman suffrage amendment have been compiled, and will be distributed at the conference for the woman's use in the primary campaign.
