FREIGHT RATES CASE **INFLUENCES MARKETS**

Speculation Slow and Price Movements Narrow Except at Periods in Wall Street During Week

Periods in Wall Street During Week

New York, Feb. 21.—The freight rates case was the main influence in the stock market this week. Speculation was slow and price movements were narrow except at periods when the market was responding to news regarding the probable course of action by the Interstate Commerce Commission. Suspension of the 4 per cent. advance of Eastern freight rates until September 12 gave stocks a severe setback at the opening of the week, but when it became known that President Wilson desired an early settlement of the case, and that the commerce commission expected to make its decision within three months, the market rose sharply.

Except for the freight rate case there were no important changes in the speculative situation. Further slow improvement was indicated in the good demand for stocks of steel and steel products companies. The expected outpouring of new capital issues, in response to improved conditions in the investment market, came this week. Several large issues of bonds, stocks and notes were arranged. New offerings of high grade securities were readily absorbed.
