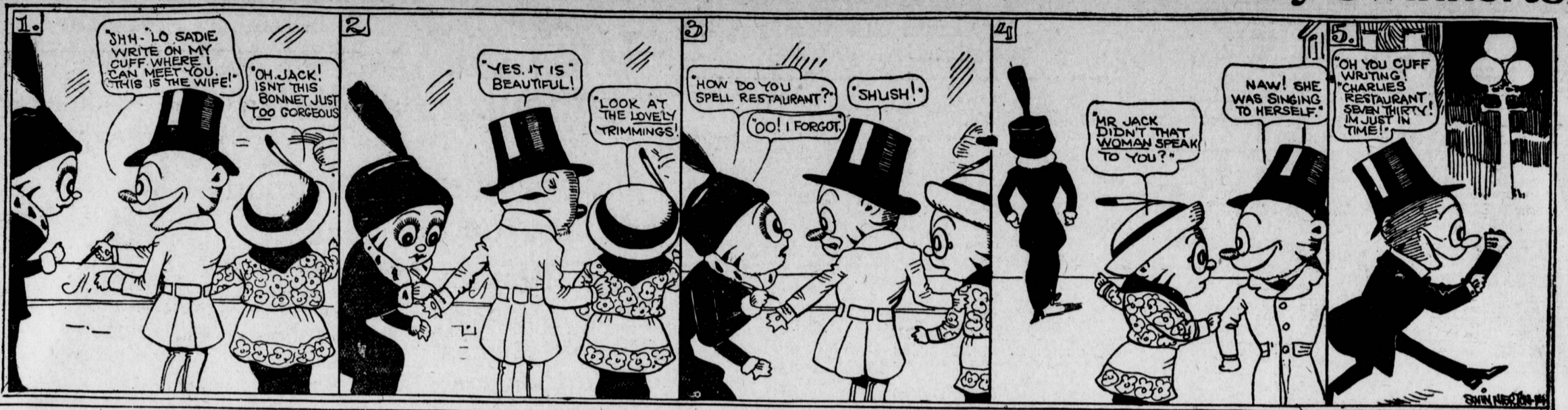

L. FRANK BASS Unanimously Chosen to Head the Casino Duckpin League Organized Last Night.

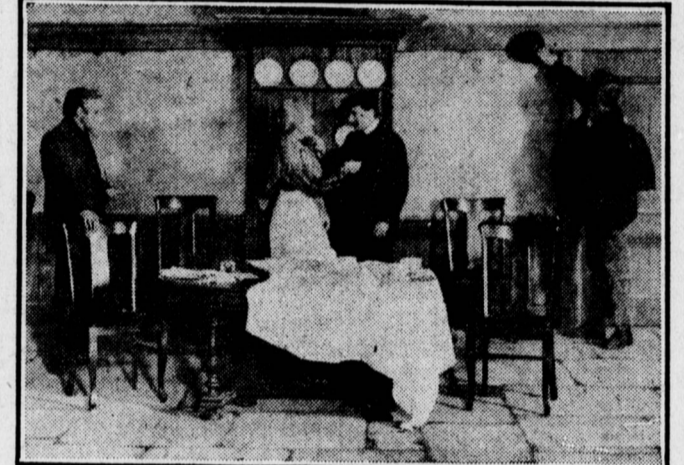
