






Hundreds of un-employed in the rural sections have been cutting ice during the past week. A big demand has sprung up for anthracite coal and the collieries of the Reading Coal and Iron Company are all making full time. About 1,900 cars are loaded at the breakers and sent to market every day. The fuel, which had been stored in cars and at the storage yards during January, is being sent forward as rapidly as it can be handled.
