State's Newest Bureau Shows the Immensity of the Production in Commonwealth

FIRST IN BUCKWHEAT

It Grows Large Quantities of Rye, Wheat, and Corn and Lots of Hay

Pennsylvania stands first among the United States as a producer of buckwheat, second in hay, fourth in rye wheat, second in hay, fourth in rye, sixth as a raiser of potatoes, eighth in wheat and tobacco, twelfth in oats and fourteenth in corn raising, according to the forthcoming report of the new bureau of statistics of the State Department of Agriculture. This bureau, which was organized last fall by the appointment of L. H. Wible, of Fulton, as chief, secured the data for first first report from assessors and

the appointment of L. H. Wible, of Fulton, as chief, secured the data for its first report from assessors and farmers in the various countles of the State for 1913.

The report shows that the total value of these eight staples grown on an agregate of 7,800,000 acres was \$168,770,000 in a State which is preeminently known as a producer of Iron and steel, coal and oil. The figures for each shows the following:

Buckwheat, 280,000 acres, 5,180,000 bushels, worth \$2.781,000. Hay, 3,-141,000 acres, 4,146,000 tons, worth \$61,775,000. Rye, 230,000 acres, 4,900,000 bushels, worth \$3,626,000. Potatoes, 265,000 acres, 23,220,000 bushels, worth \$18,854,000. Tobacco, 38,900 46,680,000 pounds, worth \$3,501,000. Oals, 1,154,000 acres, 35,774,000 bushels, worth \$16,456,000. Corn, \$1,463,000 acres, 57,057,000 bushels, worth \$41,081,000.
