In many places, how warned the women to remain away from the polls in order to avoil identification with any political party. In two cities, Canton and Carroll, women were candidates for mayor. Both were defeated.

In Yates City Republican men nominated a woman for board president,

three women for trustees and women for treasurer and clerk. No women voted in the primary.
