Well-known Upper End Farmer Hangs Himself

Elizabethville, Pa., March 13.—Henry L. Hartman, a farmer, residing about two miles north of this place, committed suicide by hanging yesterday morning. He left the house some time after 1 o'clock at night, it is believed. He failed to answer at the call for breakfast and his son Thomas went out to ascertain the reason and found him suspended with a rope in the barn. The reason for the act is unknown, except ill-health, which seemed to prey on his mind. He was a devoted member of the St. John's Lutheran Church and always active in all phases of church work. The community was greatly shocked. Coroner Eckinger held an inquest, after which Undertaker Buffington took charge of the body. He is survived by a widow and seven children, two sons and five daughters. Funeral will be held to-morrow morning.

News Items From Points in Central Pennsylvania

Shamokin.—Charles Bobbin was fatally injured at the Culbert colliery yesterday, coal falling on his back as he was loading a wagon. Reading.—The family here was notified yesterday of the sudden death of Mrs. Arthur A. Devlin, prominent Reading society woman, while on a visit to relatives in Chicago. Reading.—Mayor Ira W. Stratton yesterday announced appointment of the following to comprise Reading's first city planning commission, to assist in laying out new streets, annexing territory and recommending changes to beautify the city: Jonathan Moul, retired merchant; A. F. Smith, architect; Edward C. Nolan, banker; John Keim Stauffer, newspaper correspondent, and Edward H. Kner, banker. Pottsville.—A coroner's jury censured the Buckhorn Coal Company, the owners and operators of the Chance colliery, near St. Clair, in its verdict after an inquest into the cause of the death of David H. Geiger, of the latter place. Reading.—After being in the Schuylkill river for forty-six days, the body of Mrs. Adam Anderson, 60 years old, who with her husband was drowned when they accidentally drove into the stream during a blinding rainstorm on Saturday night, January 24, was recovered yesterday. The husband's body was found ten days after the accident. Hazleton.—The detachment of State troopers here was withdrawn yesterday and the men returned to their barracks at Wyoming, Pa., owing to the necessity of retraining because of the lack of funds for outpost duty. Hazleton.—The citizens of West Hazleton having voted authority for a loan of \$50,000 for street paving, extension of the sewerage system and other needed improvements, council will prepare at once for the sale of the bonds and the letting of contracts. Reading.—James E. Howe, aged 65 years, a machinist and former foreman of the Reading car shops, ended his life by inhaling gas.
