### What Is the Value of a Beard? Court Inquires

Washington, March 19.—What is the value of a beard? That is the novel question which the learned justices of the Supreme Court have been asked to determine.

The case in point is that of E. A. O'Sullivan, aged about 65 and a prominent Louisiana lawyer, who placed a value of \$60,000 on a growth of his beard. O'Sullivan, who formerly was district attorney, State Senator and city attorney for New Orleans, claims that he was forcibly deprived of his hirsute adornment on election day in November, 1908. On that day, he asserts, Paul Felix, a justice of the peace in the parish of Jefferson, La., and William W. Stiles, a deputy sheriff, conspired to prevent Anthony Maggioni, Michael Cristino and a number of others from voting. O'Sullivan claims he went to the polls to advise about the conduct of the election. He asserts that a number of men, imported to the election place by Felix, seized him and tied his arms to his side. Then, he claims, Stiles seized his beard, and with a pair of shears cut it off.

### Lobby Investigation Halted by DeKnight

Washington, March 19.—Members of the Senate lobby committee to-day found themselves confronted with the task of solving a legal problem affecting their authority. The committee's investigation into the alleged lobbying activities of Clarence W. DeKnight, a Washington attorney, was halted yesterday when DeKnight, on the advice of counsel refused to produce certain books and papers as to the committee had no jurisdiction over matters not now pending before Congress.

The attitude of the lawyer was laid before the committee by Chairman Overman. Testimony showing that DeKnight received \$1,000 from a ship-building company in payment for unsuccessful efforts to defeat legislation against the use of the Panama Canal by railroad-owned ships, was reviewed and it was said that additional evidence concerning DeKnight's relations with this company was considered highly important. If the committee should decide it cannot compel production of the desired papers, the Senate may be asked to give the necessary authority.

Millersburg, Pa., March 19.—Peter Hoy, 70 years old, died at the home of his son, William C. Hoy, early this morning after a short illness of pneumonia. He is survived by three sons, H. H. W. C. and J. F. Hoy, of Millersburg, and one daughter, Mrs. Strohecker, of Harrisburg; also a brother, Charles E. Hoy, and two sisters, Mrs. Charles Dreihelbis and Mrs. J. George Snyder, of Millersburg. Mr. Hoy was a member of David's Reformed Church, of Killinger. The funeral will take place Sunday afternoon, at 2 o'clock from his late residence, with short services at the house and further services in the United Brethren Church. The Rev. J. A. Reber, his pastor, assisted by the Rev. A. L. Heasler, will officiate.

### Simultaneous Attack on Two Mexican Towns Predicted in Report

It was said that while General Villa's rebel army was moving against Torreon, forces under General Alvarado Obregon would assault Mazatlan. Obregon was reported to be moving 12,000 troops against the Pacific coast port.


