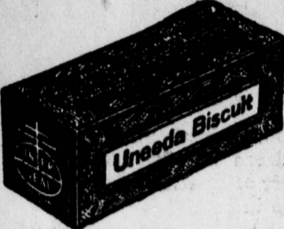

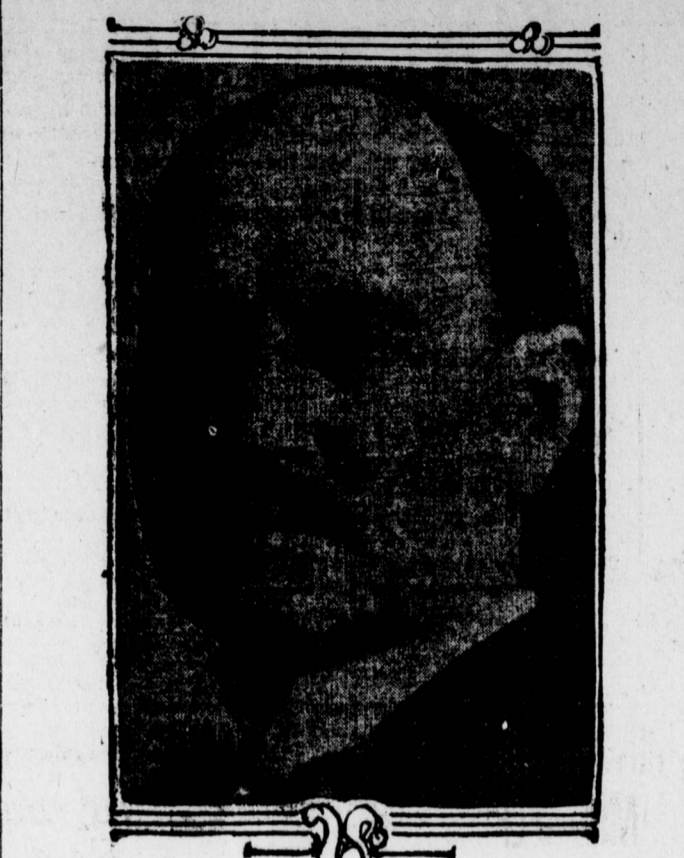

WILSON WINS FIRST SKIRMISH IN FIGHT

[Continued from First Page.] the administration leaders. The balloting was preceded by an hour of impassioned speechmaking. Speaker Clark, Representative Underwood, Representative Fitzgerald and other Democratic leaders voted against the motion to cut off debate. With the adoption of the resolution to stop debate on the rule, the next question was upon the adoption of the rule itself. Administration supporters were sure of its passage. The special rule then was adopted, 200 to 172. That put the Sims bill to repeal the exemption squarely before the House for twenty hours' debate, and protected against intervening motions and amendments.

When the Panama Canal tolls fight was resumed in the House to-day the battle lines were drawn in this manner: Forty-five minutes remained for debate on the special rule to limit discussion to twenty hours on the Sims bill to repeal the exemption for coastwise ships. Chairman Henry, of the rules committee, leading that phase of the fight for the administration forces, was ready at the conclusion of the fifty-five minutes to "move the previous question," a parliamentary maneuver to shut off debate on the rule and force a vote, the first real test of strength. Opponents of the administration program, strengthened by Speaker Clark's vigorous denunciation of the attempt at cloture and renewed by his declaration that he would vote against limiting debate, were prepared to bring every resource into play to beat "the previous question" and thus throw down the bars for unlimited debate not only on the rule but on the repeal bill itself. On this first test vote hung not only the question of pressing the administration measure through but also the greater one of opening it to amendment, for the rule proposes that only one amendment may be permitted to intervene—and that would be one motion to recommitt to the commerce committee.

CECIL A. PRESTON VALUATION ENGINEER

Former Middle Division Superintendent Has Important Task Assigned to Him



CECIL A. PRESTON Valuation Engineer of the Pennsylvania Railroad

Within the next two weeks the Pennsylvania Railroad Company will begin work on computing the physical examination of this great system. To direct this important inquiry the Pennsylvania Railroad directors have selected a gentleman well known to Harrisburgers, Cecil A. Preston, former superintendent of the Middle Division, with headquarters at Altoona. Valuation offices have been opened in the Commercial Trust Building, at Philadelphia, and an army of clerks will shortly take up the task of estimating the real value of the Pennsylvania system. Mr. Preston will be known as valuation engineer. He will make frequent trips over the main line, and will come to Harrisburg at intervals. At present he is completing plans for taking up the important work with the Interstate Commerce representatives. Cecil A. Preston began his career at the bottom of the ladder, starting as a supervisor after completing courses in college in various branches of engineering. He filled positions of importance on the main line, and was at one time superintendent of the Bedford Division. He became superintendent of the Middle Division ten years ago, and a year ago was appointed to his present position. Mr. Preston is a great organizer, and has always been considered an expert on valuations.

State Water Commission Issues Flood Warning

In accordance with the act of May 23, 1913, the Pennsylvania Water Supply Commission had the following bulletin posted this afternoon as a flood warning: "From present conditions and reports from New York State and Pennsylvania points, the Susquehanna river at Harrisburg will probably reach eleven feet five inches by tomorrow, Saturday morning. Ralph H. Hosmer, Flood Forecaster, Water Supply Commission, and the increased percentage entering for use in manufacturing, says the Department of Commerce to-day. The percentage of the imports which entered this country free of duty in 1913 was 54.47, which was larger than in any previous year, with the exceptions of 1892 and 1894, the opening and closing years of the brief period during which sugar was admitted free of duty under the act of 1890, when the percentages were 55.55 and 57.98 respectively.

POWDERY SCAB DISEASE PREVALENT IN POTATOES Washington, D. C., March 27.—Because of the prevalence of powdery scab disease in potatoes in portions of Northern Maine, the Department of Agriculture to-day warned growers to accept only seed potatoes from Aroostook county, Maine, delivered in original bags bearing the certificates of the Maine Department of Agriculture to the effect that the potatoes are free from the disease.
