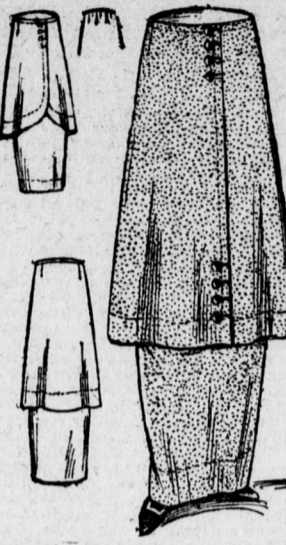

Hatchability of Eggs Influenced by Many Various Circumstances

Don't Feed Chicks Until They're 50 Hours Old Don't feed the chicks anything until they are from fifty to sixty hours old. The first feed should be finely broken grains and fine grit; often bowel trouble in chicks is traceable either to feeding them too soon or to feeding at the start some soft, wet mash.
