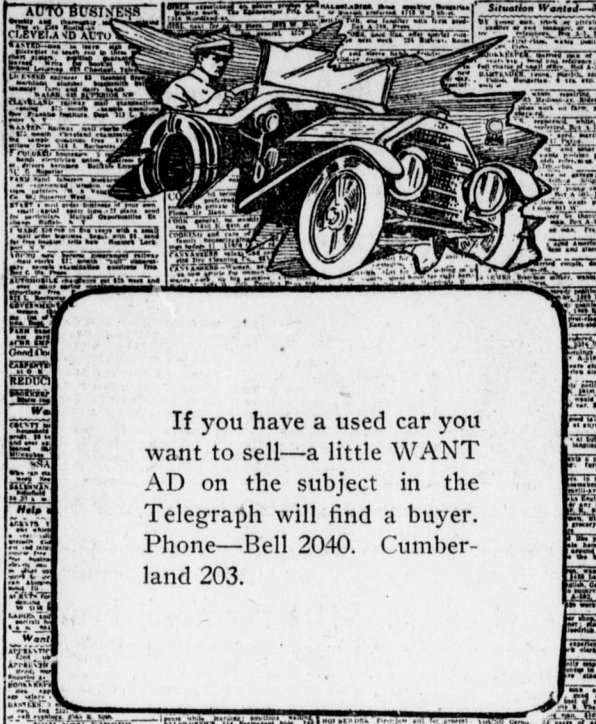

MARKET CONDITIONS GREATLY IMPROVED

Foreign Exchange Rose to Year's High Mark, But Relaxed Later; U. S. Steel Report Made

By Associated Press New York, May 2.—Stock market conditions improved definitely this week. The steady decline of the previous fortnight was checked and good progress was made on an upward swing. The change was due primarily to the prospects for a peaceable solution of the Mexican problem. Another element of strength was the improvement in London, based on the more hopeful view of the Ulster crisis. At home, sentiment was cheered by the favorable indications for crops, the improvement in railroad earnings for March, as compared with preceding months, and the prospects for a speedy decision in the freight rates case. An offsetting influence was the continued depression in business. The extent of this recession in the steel industry was measured by United States Steel's quarterly report, showing a decline of more than \$6,000,000.
