Raised a Regiment

The beginning of hostilities found him in New York raising the Excelsior Brigade of five regiments at his own expense. He even paid the maintenance bill of these regiments for several weeks before they were mustered into the service of the United States. Thus was formed the first body of United States volunteers as distinguished from those who enlisted under the banners of the States. The wisdom of huch a method of enlistment appeared all the more as the war advanced, for there was no such complications in the handling of the troops as developed among State organizations. The soldiers signed for three years, although there were men in the North who really believed that within ninety days the fighting would be all over.

Mr. Sickles was made colonel of the regiment, later designated as the Seventleth New York. His zeal and ability went hand in hand in bringing about his advancement. He was a brigadler general of volunteers in 1861 and a major general of volunteers a year later, and was retired several years after the conclusion of peace with the full rank of major general in the regular army, with which he had remained.
