



Plans for the annual fly "swatting" campaign will be formulated at a meeting of the executive committee

campaign will be formulated at a meeting of the executive committee of the Steelton Civic Club, at the home of Mrs. J. M. Heagy, South Front street, Monday afternoon.

It is the aim of the Civic Club members to make this year's war against the fly more vigorous than ever before. The usual cash prizes to the boy, or girl who "swats" the greatest number of files will likely be offered. Large red and black window posters telling of the dangerousness of the fly will be distributed about the town and other strenuous measures to rid the town of the pesky fly will be resorted to.

An innovation in the anti-fly crusade will be the placing of a large number of traps at various places along the streets of the borough. The Civic Club has considered the advisability of placing these traps about town for several months. In a number of western ditles this plan of exterminating the fly has been successfully tried and it is believed that it would work well here.
