Columbia Woman Drops Dead at Rectory Door

Columbia, Pa., May 22.—Worshippers at Holy Trinity Catholic church were startled yesterday morning on going to the church to attend high mass, to find that one of their number, Mrs. Catharine Zinkand, had dropped dead at the door of the parish rectory, which adjoins the church, and where she had gone to meet the assistant rector, the Rev. C. M. Ehalt, who was in his office. Mrs. Zinkand, who was 80 years old, had left her home a short time before and appeared to be in her usual health. She boarded a trolley car and, leaving it near the church, walked to the rectory, a few hundred feet distant. Just as she reached the door and raised her foot to the steps, she fell over and died instantly. Heart disease was the cause of death. Mrs. Zinkand is survived by four children.

DR. BRUMBAUGH TO MAKE THINGS HUM

Candidate Plans to Make a Campaign That Will Be a Dandy

Dr. Martin G. Brumbaugh, superintendent of public schools and Republican nominee for Governor, proposes to finish out his school year just as if no primaries had been held. After that he will lay aside textbooks and take his place on the stump.

"I am keenly interested in the vote at the primaries and am waiting anxiously to learn the definite figures," he said yesterday. "Then I shall give them study."

"It is my intention, however, to continue as I have been, making no political addresses as long as I am superintendent of schools. And I shall continue in that capacity until the close of the school year."

"When I shall have resigned I will go into political matters actively. I believe the people want a little rest from things political. But early in September the campaign will open and I propose then to go into every county of the State to discuss with the people the issues to be decided at the November election."

"I have, however, not yet given the slightest thought to an itinerary or to any other details. I am now concerned with the schools and will continue to give them undivided attention until the school year is over."
