



GRAMMAR SCHOOL MEET PROGRAM READY

Plans Made For Sixth Annual Contest For Young Athletes of City

Members of the Harrisburg Track Athletic Committee wrestled until midnight last night with the drawings and other details for the annual grammar school track meet, Thursday, June 4.

This year the entry list includes 215 athletes. Every grammar school building in Harrisburg will be represented. As was the case in the high school meet, five point winners will be recorded in each event. The school winning the meet will get the shield, which is held by Maclay school. The Forney school team has won it four times.

Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded the winners in each event. Events will start at 2 o'clock promptly and a meet event this year will be a one-half mile relay race for boys under 13 years. Schools entered, and the letters assigned are:
