JOSEPH SADLER
Announcement was made to-day of the retirement of Joseph Sadler, of Wornyleysburg, who entered the services of the Pennsylvania Railroad as a lineman in 1872. Mr. Sadler's retirement dates from May 1. His papers were delayed and arrived with the June pension list yesterday.

While serving as brakeman, Mr. Sadler worked after the manner of the only passenger car operated by the Northern Cumberland Railroad Company between Lemoyne and Harrisburg. This car was hauled by an engine to Bridgeport, and by gravity to Harrisburg, where it was coupled to the main line.

Mr. Sadler was a son of the late Samuel and Hettie Sadler, and was born September 3, 1844, near Oyster's Landing, near Harrisburg. He spent his boyhood days on the farm with his parents. At the age of six years, Mr. Sadler moved with his family to Milledale and resided in that vicinity for ten years.

When 23 years of age Mr. Sadler married Elizabeth, daughter of Josiah and Elizabeth Nelson. Two children were born and both are now living. The elder, Samuel, son of Josiah and Elizabeth Nelson, was born in 1872 and is now residing in Wornyleysburg. Robert N. Sadler and Mrs. William Evans, his daughter, with whom Mr. Sadler now resides.

June Pensions - Sixty-four employees of the Pennsylvania Railroad system retired upon the pension rolls during May, according to announcement made yesterday. The addition of these pensions to the list of retired employees of the system and 11 from the Western lines.

The Pennsylvania Railroad system is now carrying 1423 persons upon its pension rolls. Altogether, since the pension system was first started in 1890, there have been 8047 employees pensioned. Of this number 3924 have since died. The total amount of pension paid out since the start of the system in 1890, is \$9,912,667 in full.
