## MARKET STIFFENS AFTER SOME EARLY RECESSIONS

Bullish Operations Were Resumed in Various Issues; Bonds Were Reported Irregular

New York, June 5. — The market soon stiffened, making up the early recessions and a trifle more. Buillish operations were resumed in various issues, particularly the local traction and fertilizer shares. The heaviest business was in stocks in which a large short interest is supposed to exist. Although the upturn took the list only slightly above yesterday's close the tone was consistently good after the market had overcome the influence of the early decline.

Money rates continued easy, despite the large drain on bank reserves from interior shipments, gold exports and sub-Treasury withdrawals. Sterling exchange rates rose as money went down. Demand bills touched 488.80, close to the season's highest, and further exports of gold were looked for. Bonds were irregular.
