New York, June 22.—Plans for a world church peace council to be held in Constance, Switzerland, on August 2, and to continue four days, the first event of its kind in history, were announced last night by Dr. Frederick Lynch, secretary of the Church Pace Union, founded by Andrew Carnegie in February with an endowment of \$2,000,000.

On the same days, in Liego, Belgium, a peace conference of Catholics has been arranged under the leadership of Count Albert Apponyi, the Hungarian statesman and peace advocate. Both meetings will be under the auspices of the Carnegie Union.
