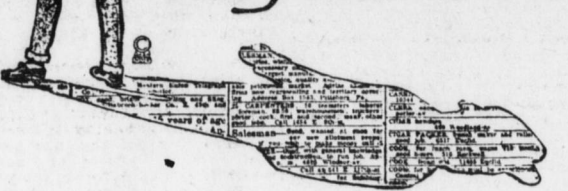

QUOTATIONS RECEDE AFTER FIRST RUSH

Gains in Various Industrial Securities Attract Little Attention; Bonds Irregular

By Associated Press New York, July 1. — Quotations again receded after the first rush of short covering, that movement constituting a large part of the first hour's activity. The market then drifted idly with business at low ebb. Expiration of the bond conversion privilege accounted for the comparative strength of Brooklyn Transit, but such changes as were recorded elsewhere had no especial significance. The market was pointed in various industrial securities of a speculative character attracted little attention. Bonds were irregular, Rock Island collaterals ruling arm in the face of unfavorable May earnings.
