

MARKET DROPS BACK TO USUARY DULLNESS

In Special Group Advances of 1 to 2 Points Were Scored; Bonds Were Irregular

New York, July 6.—Following the prevailing tendency, the market fell back into its customary dullness after a quiet hour, with moderate fluctuations from the best Northern Pacific, Norfolk and Western and Amalgamated, and only important stock to rival Union Pacific with one point gains. In the special group, however, advances of 1 to 2 points were scored by Pittsburgh Coal, Pfd., Goodrich, Steel Foundries, American Coal Products, Pfd., and United States Express. The only pronounced feature of the irregular bond market was a new low record for Missouri Pacific Converter at 111 1/2.
