



CUT OUT THE DISPUTES FFERENCES between con-tractors and engineers are always incidental to big public




Thus far in the present season th various projects have been carried forward with more or less ginger, but within the last few days another con troversy has arisen over a section of the river wall protective system. Owing to a slight change of the original line for a few yards the operations on the wall have been suspended at the point in dispute. This is serious in ore ways than one. All the conditions are ideal at the present time for pushing ahead with the work along the river and the forces having been organized for the summer such delays are always discouraging and costly
