American Wins First Race in Annual Canoe Tests

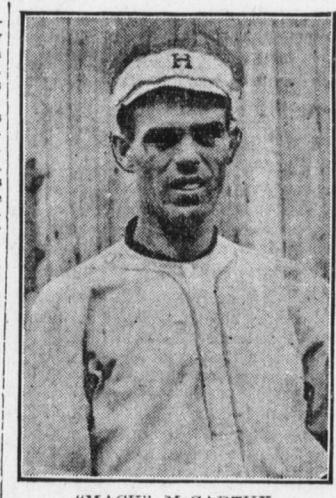
New York, July 11.—The second series of test races to select the winner of the international sailing trophy in contests against Canada next week, were to be held to-day on the Gravesend bay course.
