The mayor also complained that consumers were compelled to place a deposit of \$5.00 with the company to obtain service.

Bruce H. Campbell, who represented the company, made a point to show the commission that Mayor Cauffiel was not here in the capacity of mayor of Johnstown, but as an individual; that he was unauthorized by council or the city solicitor to file the complaint, and that he was not senerally urged to do so by the patrons of the electric company. Attorney Campbell read extracts from the opinions of commissions in other States and from court decisions to the effect that a minimum rate of \$1.00 was not exorbitant, and claimed that this was the charge of other companies in towns surrounding Johnstown and in various other parts of the State. The \$5.00 deposit was not exacted from property owners, and was only accepted as a guarantee, to be returned with 5 per cent. Interest when the service terminated.
