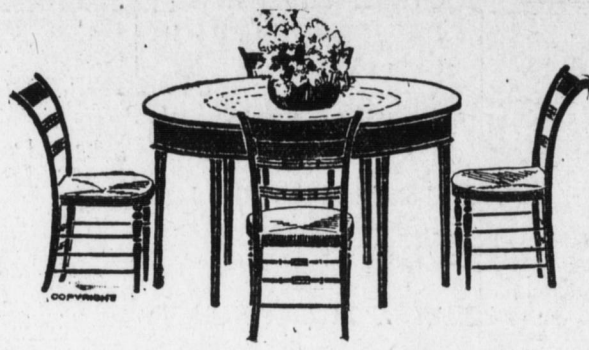

The following ordinance was read in place in the City Council at its meeting held Tuesday Afternoon, July 28, 1914, and is published as required by Article 5, Section 2, Clause 10, of the Charter of Assembly approved June 27, 1913:

AN ORDINANCE
Authorizing The Bell Telephone Company of Pennsylvania, its successors and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate its posts, poles, cables, wires, and all other necessary overhead apparatus on, over and along, and its conduits, ducts, mains, pipes, cables, wires, manholes, terminal and distributing poles, and all other necessary underground appliances on, in, under and through the streets, alleys and highways within the limits of the Borough of Highspire, in the County of Dauphin, in the State of Pennsylvania, and prescribing the manner of placing the same, and regulating the use of the same, alleys and highways by said company.
