Bundy, national doubles champions and defenders of the Davis cup, on the turf courts of the West Side Tennis Club at Forest Hills, Long Island, in the third contest of the series in straight sets, 6-2, 8-6, 3-7. The victory places Australasia in the lead, 2 to 1, and it will be necessary for America to capture both singles matches today in order to retain the trophy.
