German Vessels Have Received Turkish Names

London, Aug. 15, 3.05 a. m.—The Dally Mail states that the cruisers Goeben and Breslau, reported to have been purchased from Germany by Turkey, have received Turkish names and will be placed under the command of Rear Admiral Arthur H. Limpus, of the British havy, who was lent to the Turkish government.

The Mail says that Turkey does not intend to employ the warships against Russia and adds:

"There appears to be no doubt that their purchase is a direct contravention of international law, but the opinion is gaining ground in diplomatic circles that Turkey s the victim of a German trap to embroil her with the Triple Entente."

Rear Admiral Limpus has been naval adviser to the Turkish government since 1912.
