

MEXICO ON VERGE OF WAR WITH U.S. TWO WEEKS AGO

High Officials in Washington Reveal Crisis That Impended When Carranza Balked


Special to The Telegraph Washington, Aug. 19. — Just how obese the United States came to being involved in a war with Mexico as re-cently as a fornight ago was revealed to-day by high officials of the Admin-Istration

When General Carranza abruptly re-When General Carranza abrupty re-jected the overtures of the peace en-voys sent by Provisional President Car-bajal drastic measures were urged upon President Wilson. Many members of the Cabinet-it is said a majority -President Wilson. Many members of the Cablent--ti is said a majority --favored sending American troops to the Mexican capital to prevent anarchy. President Wilson, however, contended that sending American troops to Mex-ico City probably would mean war with the approaching Constitutionalists. A few days later, actual overtures came from the Carbajal Government In an indirect way to the effect that if American troops would come, they would be assisted.
