Six Sons to Carry Body of William Wharton to Grave

William H. Wharton, Civil War veteran and retired Pennsylvania Railroad employe, died Saturday at the age of 69 at his home, 554 Woodbine street. A year ago, when Mr. Wharton was at the Gettysburg reunion, he suffered a sunstroke and two weeks ago another.

With six sons acting as pallbearers, the body will be buried in Harrisburg Cemetery Tuesday. Funeral services will be conducted at the home Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock by the Rev. Floyd Appleton, rector of St. Paul's Protestant Episcopal Church.

Mr. Wharton is survived by his wife; a daughter, Mrs. Thomas Hollahan, and seven sons; Harry, of Alliance, Ohio; John, this city; Richard M. H., general manager of the Patriot; Elliott, of New Cumberland; Samuel, of Conway; Paul, of Middletown, and George, this city.

Mr. Wharton enlisted three times during the Civil War. He first entered the field with the Twentieth Pennsylvania Volunteers. At the close of the war, in July, 1865, he was a corporal in the Twenty-first Cavalry.

He was at Appomattox when Lee surrendered and participated in twenty-two campaigns during the war. He was past commander of Post 116, Grand Army of the Republic, a member of the Odd Fellows, Red Men, Knights of Pythias, Golden Eagles and the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Engineers. He was a member of the visiting committee of the Pennsylvania Railroad Veteran Association.
