Special to The Telegraph Chicago, Ill., Sept. 22.—An early start of the world's championship series is assured by Ban B. Johnson, president of the American League. Announcement was made yesterday that the series would start October 8, one day after the season ended.

"It is our aim to start and finish he series as early as possible," said ohnson. "I believe we can arrange o play the first flame on Thursday, totober 8. There is no reason why a ay should intervene between the lose of the season and the inaugural f the Fall games. Things can be so rranged as to make it possible to lay on October 8 and the other memers of the commission probably will avor this arrangement. In the event f a hitch, October 9 will be set as he opening date. The commission will determine this at a meeting to e held as soon as the races are settled."

In the event of the Braves and Athletics being contenders for the big title two games will be played consecutively in each city instead of alternating each day, as was the case between New York and Philadelphia. The place for the opening game will be settled by the flip of a coin.


