He was the good friend of all the tavern and saloonkeepers and several years ago, in their attempt to defeat local option in Shippensburg, he was the individual who is said to have handled the campaign funds. It is stated that he now owns a small hotel at Churchtown, which is at present licensed.

It is not strange that the temperance people in this section believe that the action of the Harrisburg conference, which seems to have been called in the interest of the Democratic candidate for Governor, was neither consistent nor fair.
