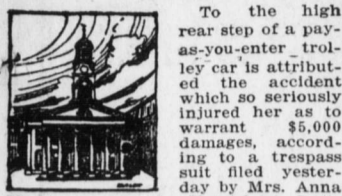


BLAMES HIGH STEP FOR HER INJURIES

Suit Against Trolley Company For \$5,000 Damages Filed by Mrs. Anna Martin



To the high rear step of a trolley car is attributed the accident which so seriously injured her as to warrant a \$5,000 damages suit filed yesterday by Mrs. Anna Martin against the Harrisburg Railway Company.

No statement was filed, but Attorney O. G. Wickersham, counsel for Mrs. Martin, declared that the plaintiff tried to climb the rear step of a car at Sixth and Maclay streets, but that the step was so high her skirt caught. Before she could complete the ascent the car had started, she contends, and she was thrown in such a way as to seriously injure her. The plaintiff is in her fifties, Mr. Wickersham said.

Russians Driven From Hungarian Territory

Dissolution Suit Continued Today

At the outset he denied that the earnings of the corporations were excessive but declared that on the contrary they were quite ordinary. Waynesboro, Pa., Oct. 22.—With impressive ceremonies the cornerstone of the new sanctuary of St. Mary's Protestant Episcopal parish was laid yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock.

Carlisle, Pa., Oct. 22.—Enlisting at the outbreak of hostilities in 1861 as a drummer in the One Hundred and Twentieth Infantry, and serving through the war as one of the youngest boys in the rang, Ishmael Stonestifer, one of the most prominent surviving veterans of the Civil War, died at his home here yesterday. He was 72 years old. Surviving him are his wife and two children, George W. Stonestifer, of Harrisburg, and George Brown, of Carlisle. Four brothers, William, of Carlisle; Calvin, of Wil-

ington, Del.; John, of Williamsport, and Curtis, of California, also survive. He will be buried with full military honor on Saturday afternoon.
