U. P. EXTENSION SCHOOL ORGANIZES

Constitution Adopted and Officers Will Be Elected at Meeting Next Wednesday

Ira L. Gordon, of the bridge and construction department of the Pennsylvania Steel Company, has been appointed temporary chairman on organization of the Harrisburg Extension School of the University of Pennsylvania. He recently appointed a constitutional committee including the following men:

George W. Hill, Jr., Harrisburg Technical High School; P. A. Fishel, Harrisburg Central High School; Samuel S. Hecker, 49 South Eleventh street; George H. Wirt, State Department of Forestry; Roy G. Mumma, Hershey, Pa.; Harry F. McFadden, 108 North Second street; Raymond S. Caton, 208 Walnut street.

This committee last night submitted a constitution which was read and adopted unanimously after a few changes. According to the constitution, the organization shall be known as the Harrisburg Wharton Extension School Association. It further provides that there shall be elected a president, three vice-presidents, a secretary, a treasurer, an advisory committee of seven and a cheer leader. In addition the president has the power to appoint any other necessary committees, and in view of the fact that the school has already been invited to play the Philadelphia evening school a series of basketball games, it is quite possible that the president, soon to be elected, will immediately appoint an athletic committee to look after the school's athletics.

Professor Wendell P. Raine, who paid the school a visit last night, stated that the Scranton and Wilkes-Barre schools were already organized along literary, debating, athletic, social publicity and other lines, and were very anxious to have a series of debates, basketball and baseball games with the Harrisburg school before the close of the college year.

Nominations for officers will be received next Wednesday evening, November 4, and the election of officers will take place Wednesday evening, November 11.

Dillsburg, Pa., Oct. 30.—On Sunday morning the Rev. Charles Heikes will preach his farewell sermon in the Andersonstown Church of God and in the evening in the Mount Pleasant church. The Rev. Mr. Heikes has accepted the unanimous call from the Church of God at Mount Pleasant and will take up his work at that place on November 8. The Rev. Mr. Heikes had been pastor of the Mount Pleasant, Andersonstown, Lisburn and Fairview Bethel churches for six years and had the unanimous vote of all churches of the charge to return again this year. During the six years the Rev. Mr. Heikes built the handsome new church at Mount Pleasant at a cost of \$4,300, all of which is paid; extensively improved and beautified the Andersonstown church and the Fairview Bethel Church and improved the parsonage. He also married 75 couples and officiated at 118 funerals.

Will Lay Big Water Mains Through Subway Via Section of Park

To avoid tearing up the newly-paved sections of the Front street subway approaches, Contractor M. F. Saul will extend that portion of the new 12-inch water main line beneath the Cumberland Valley tracks by lay-

ing the pipe in the park close to the western curb. This switch from the street to the park will be but a very small section of the system and will be made only in the portion of the park where there are no trees to be interfered with.

Splendid headway is being made on the big contract, and up to date the 16-inch main has been laid as far south as Market street from North, and water has actually been turned into the pipes down to Market. While

one gang is proceeding with the excavations out Market street preparatory to continuing the line out into the business section, another gang is moving on down Front street with the 12-inch main.

HALLOWEEN PARTY WILL BE LED TO PLACE BY WITCHES
Annville, Pa., Oct. 30.—A Halloween celebration by the Philokosmian Literary Society of Lebanon Valley Col-

lege will be held to-morrow evening at a place which is not known until the witches, who lead the procession, take the students to the place.
