### Rockefeller Food Ship Sails to Aid Belgians

New York, Nov. 4.—The Ameican steamship Massapequa, chartered and loaded by the Rockefeller Foundation to convey food to starving Belgians, sailed for Rotterdam yesterday afternoon. The Massapequa, with a cargo representing an expenditure of \$300, 000, is the first of several ships to sail for Belgian relief at the expense of the Rockefeller Foundation. Less than thirty-six hours were required for loading, the stevedores working night and day stowing away the suplies as fast as they arrived. The lies as fast as they arrived. The original estimate of the cost of the cargo was increased, it is said, by about \$30,000 by reason of heavy purchases and a sudden advance in the market price when sellers learned that Rockefeller money was being spent.
