THE following order of general quarantine was adopted by the State Livestock Sanitary Board November 10, 1914, and supersedes the order of general quarantine adopted November 5, 1914, on certain counties.

The fact has been determined by the State Livestock Sanitary Board and notice is hereby given that foot and mouth disease which has been and is adjudged Cand proclaimed by the said Board to be of a transmissible character exists in PENNSYLVAN Oughout the STATE OF Therefore the State Livestock Sanitary Board under authority conferred by law does hereby establish a general quarantine throughout the STATE OF PENNSYLVANIA, subjecting to said quarantine all cattle, sheep, other ruminants or swine.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, First: No cattle, sheep, other ruminants or swine shall be removed from or out of the said quarantine area.

Second: No cattle, sheep, other ruminants or swine shall be removed from or out of the said quarantine area.

Second: No cattle, sheep, other ruminants or swine shall be moved into the said quarantine darea, except on official permit and for immediate slaughter.


