LIGHT PAXTANG WITH ELECTRICITY

Ordinance to Provide Street Illumination Will Be Offered in Council Monday

Paxtang's streets will be lighted with electricity before January 1 if an ordinance to be introduced in the borough council Monday evening becomes a law without undue delay. The measure will provide, it is understood, for at least a dozen modern incandescent lamps of 22 or 48-candlepower and will be placed at intersections and other points to be decided upon by the councilmen. The street lighting will be one of the first of the modern improvements to be introduced by Dauphin county's baby borough. If the ordinance is passed work on the installation of the system will be started at once so as to provide light by the first of the year.

Power for the lighting will be furnished by the Harrisburg Light and Power Company from the city station, and the methods, the type of light standard, the size of the conductors, both strengths of incandescent and any other information on the question will be explained by Robert W. Hoy, commercial manager of the electric company.

Paxtang will be the fifth town in this vicinity to consider the plan of obtaining power supplied by the Harrisburg company, and there is a possibility that a sixth will be added to the list in the near future. Steelton set the pace, Dauphin followed, Penbrook was next. Highspire took up the problem, but has not yet decided whether it and Paxtang is to finish the list.

The sixth town will likely be Lincolnton, as it is understood that the townships are considering the plan of obtaining electric service for its streets from this city.

FOUR UNIVERSITY TEACHERS REPORTED FALLEN IN BATTLE

Berlin, via The Hague and London, Nov. 13, 9:18 a. m. — The newspapers printed yesterday, and to-day's editions of four university professors who have just fallen in battle, showing how large a number are participating in the active fighting. The fallen men are: Heinrich Henkel, professor of church history at Kiel; Ernst Heidrich, professor of art and history at Strassburg; Ernst Stadler, professor of German philology at Strasbourg; and Professor Friedrich von der Haver-Muenden Forestry Academy.

Frau Dolbrueck, wife of the Minister of Interior and Vice-Chancellor, Otto von Helldorf, is dead.

Count Matthias Brudzewski, an ex-member of the Reichstag who shot his wife and nephew in his native Poland, died in France. He had received the decoration of the Iron Cross of the first class for valor in the battle of Augustowo.
