Between Emerald and Maclay and Fourth and Fifth streets the wires are also underground, and there is an additional triangular section at Thirteenth and Derry streets where the poles have been removed.

It is the purpose of the Bell Company to put all of the wires in the Capitol Park extension district underground as rapidly as the ground there is cleared, and a conduit will be run out Walnut street to Filbert, in Filbert to State and in State to Sixteenth, to join the system covering that district. Preliminary lines have been run, for contemplated extensions in other directions, and while in time the Bell hopes to have all its city wires underground, those outlined will be attended to first.

Co-operating with the Harrisburg Heat and Light Company, the Bell has removed many of its poles in various parts of town. These two corporations, wherever possible, are using the same pole lines. Where the Bell has had first right of way the Light Company has placed its wires on Bell poles, and the Bell has used Light poles in other sections.


