Sunbury.--Caught under a fall of coal while he was at work as a practical miner, Joseph Sinoogen, Shamokin, suffered terrible lacerations of the head and neck. Fellow workmen rescued him.
Sunbury.--Kicked by a horse at Lewisburg, L. Joseph Guarino, 36 years old, a fruit dealer, suffered in-

juries from which he died in a few hours.
Sunbury.--Fifteen large turkeys were killed for the annual Thanksgiving feast of the 200 orphans at the Central Pennsylvania Odd Fellows Orphans' Home, near here yesterday.
Marietta.--Professor George B. Rodger, organist and choirmaster of St. James Episcopal Church, Lancaster, assisted by Miss Maud Marshall, soprano soloist, also of Lancaster, gave an organ recital yesterday in the Zion Reformed Church, when the new pipe organ was used for this occasion the first time.
Waynesboro.--To-day was one of

much happiness among the poor families of Waynesboro when they were tendered their annual Thanksgiving dinner by the Waynesboro Relief Association in the marketplace.
Allentown.--Max Boneberger, aged 68, veteran locomotive engineer, dropped dead last night while eating his Thanksgiving dinner.
Pottsville.--The Historical Society of Schuylkill county elected Captain Baird Halberstadt, of this city, president, and Joseph F. Patterson, of this city; J. H. GUNNERS FIND DEAD MAN

Huntingdon, Pa., Nov. 27.--Yester-

day the body of a well-groomed man, about 26 years old, was found in the woods near Mapleton by a party of gunners. The man had evidently been killed by a 38 caliber bullet which pierced his brain at close range. His identity is unknown here. A pocket knife found on his person bore the inscription "P. B. Mt. Union, Pa."
SERGEANT BLAINE DIES

Milton, Pa., Nov. 27.--Sergeant Samuel M. Blaine, 75 years old, died at his home here of complications of diseases. He served four years during

the Civil War and was in command of a squad of Company D, Seventh Pennsylvania Cavalry, which captured Jefferson Davis, President of the Confederacy, in Florida. Sergeant Blaine secured a new set of harness off Davis' horse and used it during the war, after which he brought it to Milton, where it was for many years a curiosity.
NEW FIRE HOUSE
