BUSINESS IN BONDS LIGHT ON EXCHANGE

Few Changes of Price Noted in the Limited Deals During Morning

By Associated Press New York, Dec. 4.—Business in bonds on the Stock Exchange under limited regulations was continued today with light trading. Such relatively active issues as United States Steel 5s and New York Railway Adjuvants 6s opened unchanged. New York City 4s of 1859 declined 3 points. Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railway debenture 5s rose 1 1/2. Dealings in the first hour were moderately large, but fell away toward noon. Rock Island issues were again the feature, advances running from a substantial fraction to two points. New York City 4s of 1859 lost 3 1/2 points. Wabash 2ds, 9 1/2; Missouri, Kansas and Texas 2ds, 5 1/2; and Oregon Short Line 4s and 5s, 3 1/2 and 4 1/2, respectively. Rapid absorption of the \$12,700,000 4 per cent. trust certificates of the Canadian Pacific, to complete an increasing investment demand.

PAID-UP AMERICAN GOODS

New York, Dec. 4.—At the eighth annual convention of the American Association of Woolen and Worsted Manufacturers at Delmonico's Richard A. Strong, the retiring president, urged the members to push the campaign for "Made-in-America" goods. Mr. Strong said that the manufacturers present could, if they would, greatly influence public sentiment in favor of domestic goods. The advisability of woolen manufacturers supporting for another year the textile associations for the detection and prevention of undervaluations and incorrect classifications on imported fabrics was discussed at length. Joseph Grundy said that the work performed by the bureau was of the utmost importance to domestic manufacturers and should be strongly supported.
