BUY MILLION BIBLES FOR SOLDIERS IN WAR

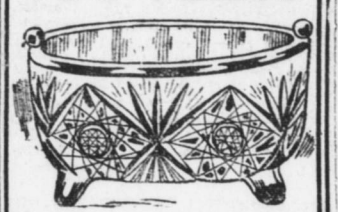
World's S. S. A. Makes Appeal to Sunday Schools Throughout United States

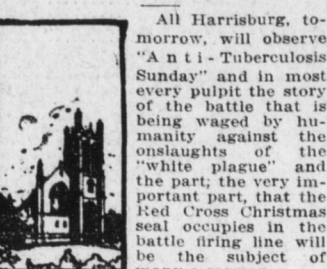
